## History - Romans in Britain

Through our study of this topic, the children will learn to construct informed responses that involve thoughtful selection and organisation of relevant historical information. They will come to understand how our knowledge of the past is constructed from a range of sources. They will explore:

The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54 BC

The power of the Roman Empire and its army

The successful invasion by Claudius and the conquest of Britain, including Hadrian's Wall British resistance, including Boudicca
The legacy of Roman culture on later periods in British history

We will also explore geographical aspects of the Roman invasion, including map work.

#### Science - Space & Light

Understand that the earth is part of the wider Solar System and explore the different planets orbiting our sun.

Understand about the earth's rotation on its axis to create night and day and its wider orbit to create the seasons.

Explore the phases of the moon and why they occur.


Know that stars, planets and moons exert a gravitational force.

#### English - writing

**Grammar/punctuation** – use a wide range of techniques to create exciting and effective setting and character descriptions, using word choices to change and enhance meaning and punctuating with accuracy and flair. Main, subordinate and relative clauses. Speech punctuation. Explore the correct use of a range of tenses through a range of writing.

**Fiction writing** – The story of the Roman invasion from a soldier's perspective. Writing to inspire: Boudicca's rallying speech **Non-fiction writing-** instructions for building a Roman Road. Information text: The Romanisation of Britain. Balanced argument: the advantages and disadvantages of the Roman invasion.

Speaking and listening/drama will be integrated throughout, with particular emphasis on hot-seating, talk for writing and P4C (Philosophy for Children) discussion.

Read and analyse My Story: Roman Invasion, exploring the impact of vocabulary and structure.

Explore non-fiction texts linked to the Romans.

Retrieve information from a wide range of texts, to demonstrate comprehension and inference skills.

Increase knowledge and accuracy of homophones, prefixes, suffixes, exception words etc. as per National Curriculum.
